Australia's Keys to Competitiveness

Primary Aluminium

- Australia is the **7th** largest global producer.
- Electricity accounts for **30-40%** of smelters cost base and is a key driver of competitiveness.


Alumina

- Australia is the **2nd** largest global producer and largest exporter.
- Energy accounts for **30-40%** of refineries cost base and is a key driver of competitiveness.
- Proximity to bauxite is a key driver, although bauxite is now increasingly mobile and access to green energy is of increasing comparative importance.


Global Aluminium Production Rankings

Bauxite


- Australia is the **2nd** largest global producer and **2nd** largest exporter.
- Australian bauxite mining is regarded as having some of the highest sustainability standards in the world, particularly for rehabilitation.
- Guinea is the world's largest exporter, principally to China, including some captive bauxite mines.
